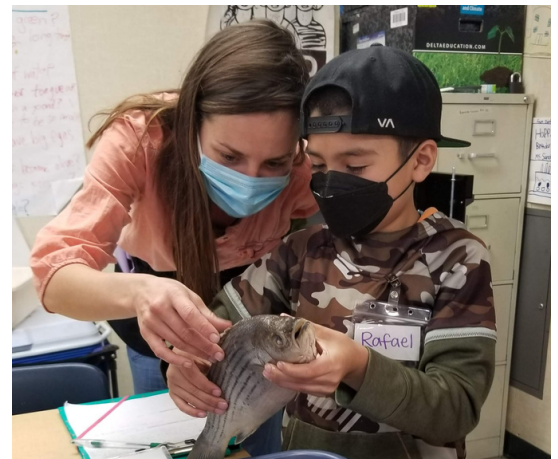

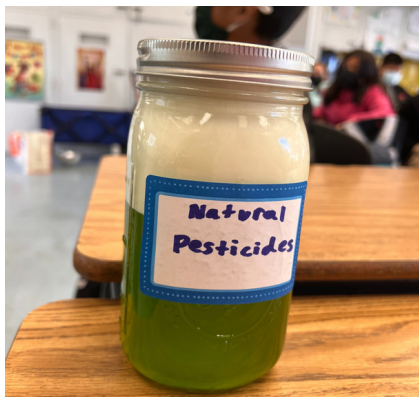
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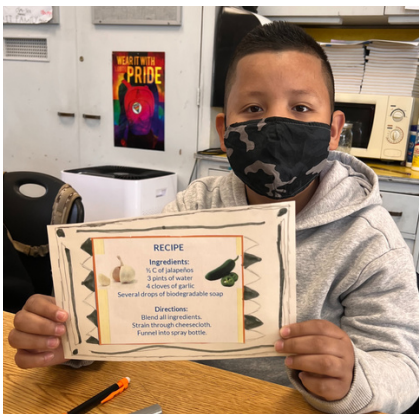


"I had no idea all of these amazing creatures live just beneath the surface of the creek. I will never look at a creek the same again."
